

Daniel

Marseille, France

- 1762 Instrument maker Charles Daniel establishes in Marseille, France (*The New Langwill Index*).
- 1800 Son Edmond is the successor (*NLI*).
- 1852 E. Daniel is the successor (Edmond's son?) with Francois Sudre (1844-1912), later his apprentice (*NLI*).
- 1878 Alexandre Guerin, luthier, is successor to Edmond Daniel at rue Paradis 18, Marseille (dir).
- c1880 Bell marked "A. Guerin / peur de l'armee / & conservatoire / Marseille" (photo 3).
- 1884 Daniel and Sudre make a compensating valve named after Arban (*NLI*).
- 1889 Daniel displays compensating instruments at the Paris Exhibition (*NLI*).
- 1897 Guerin dies.
- 1905 Elie Degremont (b.1850) is successor to Guerin, purchasing the company in March (dir) (photo 4 marked "A. Degremont").
- 1914 Elie Degremont, pianos, rue Paradis 18 (dir).
- 1922 Elie Degremont, pianos, cornets & trumpets (dir).
- 1938 E. Degremont, trumpets & bugles, Paradis 18 (dir).
