

Andrew Ellard

Dublin

- 1810 Andrew Ellard (1780-1859) is said to have made the original keyed bugle for the Halliday patent, which was submitted to the Duke of Kent for his band. He would have been working for Logier at the time at #27 Lower Sackville Street in Dublin (*Music Trade Review*, 1904).
- 1818 Ellard is successor to Logier, #27 Lower Sackville St (*New Langwill Index*).
- 1822 Ellard moves to #47 Lower Sackville St. Later instruments are marked "Ellard / 47 Sackville St / Dublin / unicorn head logo" (*NLI*).
- 1834 Ellard is listed in the city directory as manufacturer of portable organs, music seller and maker of military instruments.
- 1836 Ellard is the inventor and manufacturer of the Seraphine; a type of piano or organ (advertising).
- 1838 Ellard moves to Sydney in the summer (*australharmony*).
- 1840 Ellard returns to Dublin (*australharmony*).
- 1845 Ellard address now Tritonville, Irishtown (*NLI*).
