## **Gautrot**

## **Paris**

- 1835 Pierre Louis Gautrot joins Guichard of Paris as associate then later as brother-in-law (*NLI*).
- 1845 Gautrot becomes the owner, Cloitre Notre Dame 6 & 8 (*Grove's*).
- 1846 Gautrot has a workforce of 200 (NLI).
- 1849 Moves to a larger location at rue St. Louis 64 and adds woodwinds to their brass production (*Grove's & NLI*).
- 1850 Gautrot adds a London branch (NLI).
- 1851 Now Gautrot anie et Cie., rue St. Louis 64.
- 1853 Now at rue St. Louis 60 (*NLI*).
- 1855 They open a 2<sup>nd</sup> factory at Chateau-Thierry, Paris, with a workforce at 300 (*NLI*).
- Now branch offices in Madrid, Napoli, & New York (*NLI*). Receives French patent for the sarrusophone (photo 1).
- 1862 Workforce now at 700 (NLI).
- 1867 Annual production up to 24,000 brass instruments; now at rue de Turenne 80 (*NLI*).
- 1875 Registered trade names "Gautrot-Marquet" for 1<sup>st</sup> quality and "Gautrot-aine" for 2<sup>nd</sup> quality (*NLI*).
- 1877 Now Gautrot aine-Durand et Cie. (NLI).
- 1881 Gautrot buys oboe maker Triebert (Grove's).
- 1882 Gautrot dies.
- 1883 Purchased by Couesnon (NLI).
- 1884 Now at rue d'Angouleme (NLI).
