

# D & P Lebrun

## Bruxelles

1836 Henri Lebrun (1814-?) starts working for Adolphe Sax.

1850 Henri starts a valve making factory in Bruxelles.

1870 Lebrun factory at 1 rue de la Prevoyance, Bruxelles.

This photo of Prevoyance street shows 1 at the corner on the right side and #23 is the light-colored building further up.



1873 Lebrun receives patent #32031 for valve design.

1899 Son Michele Lebrun (1836-1903) receives a gold medal at the Paris expo. He had trained with Mahillon and became chief of valve production there before joining his father.

1903 Michele dies and sons Desire and Pierre take over the business; now at #19 rue de la Prevoyance.

1910 Lebrun wins a gold medal at the Bruxelles expo for seven valve trombone.

1914 Lebrun moves to 23 rue de la Prevoyance.

1930 Lebrun moves to 110 rue de G. Leclercq (photo 5).

They were still active after WWII.

Instruments found are marked "D & P Lebrun" and would date to the early 1900s and later. Photos here are from Horn-u-copia.net and internet auction sales.
