
- 1863 William Edward Leeder is born on October 27 in Springfield, Illinois to William & Flora (census & Find-a-Grave).
- 1880 William is learning the machinist trade (census).
- 1893 William applies for a patent on a cornet mouthpiece design on April 22. His application declares that the heavy weight acts as a counterbalance for the horn and the large face aids in reducing fatigue while playing.
- 1896 William receives patent #556,757 on March 24 (below).


