Lyons Band Instrument Co.

- 1920 William H. Lyons (1896-1989) is living in New Trier, IL with his cousin Howard R. Lyons (1899-?). William is a manager for a phonograph company and Howard is an assistant in a clothing store (census).
- 1928 The company is started by cousins William H. and Howard R. Lyons, along with Clarence L. McCreery, as a school band rental program. #17 West Lake St, Chicago (dir).
- 1936 They start *The Lyons Band News*.
- 1940 All three partners are still with the business. Clarence is listed as an employee (census).
- 1942 Lyons is still located at #14 West Lake St (draft).
- 1948 Lyons is now at #223 West Lake St (dir).
- 1969 New address is #688 Industrial Drive, Elmhurst, IL.
- 1970 Lyons is purchased by Selmer and moved to Elkhart. Any instrument production ends.
- 1990s Lyons name is sold and is currently Lyons Music Products, a division of Woodwind & Brasswind.

Brass instruments with the Lyons name are all stencils that apparently came from various sources. Their two models are "Challenger" and "Monarch". Finding the sources would be a matter of checking the receiver for a country of import or matching the design to a known maker.

One of the Monarch trumpets is made by Harry Pedler & Sons (photo 6 on right) and is their ART model. I had one Monarch trumpet with a serial number within 100 of a Pedler ART trumpet, and they are identical. These have short action valves with bottom springs and are well made student horns. These date to the 1940s and 1950s.
