The 1908 Sears catalog shows one page of band instruments by Tourville & Co. of Paris.

The name "Tourville" appears in *The New Langwill Index*, an international reference book of makers, as a tradename used for imported instruments. As with the other offerings by Sears, these were made in Austria probably by Bohland & Fuchs. This line was the intermediate price level offering and the French name was used just to make them more appealing. They all came with pearl inserts on the finger buttons.
